Civil Society Refers to Non-Government Organizations, Community Groups, and Associations of Citizens Involved in Public Activities.

Examples of Civil Society Actors

- HR Defenders (e.g. On-line Activists);
- HR Organizations (e.g. NGOs, Associations, Victim-support Groups);
- Coalitions & Networks (e.g. Women's Rights, Children's Rights or Environmental Issues);
- Persons with Disabilities, and their Representative Organizations;
- Community-based Groups (Indigenous people, Minorities, Rural Communities);
- Faith-based Groups (Mosques, Churches);

Examples of Civil Society Actors (2)

- Unions (e.g. Trade Unions, Professional Associations such as Associations of Journalists, Associations of Judges and Lawyers, Student Unions);
- Social Movements (e.g. Peace Movements, Student Movements, Pro-democracy Movements);
- Professionals Supporting the Promotion of HR (e.g. Humanitarian Workers, Lawyers, Doctors and Medical Workers);
- > Relatives and Associations of Victims of HR Violations;
- Public Institutions Promoting HR (Schools, Universities, Research Bodies); and
- > Cooperatives & Economic Associations.

Role of NGOs in Promoting Human Rights

- Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) Have
 Assumed Increasingly Important Role in Promoting
 Human Rights.
- Many NGOs Also Provide Interventions in Socio-economic Development Areas such as:
 - Poverty Alleviation,
 - Women Empowerment,
 - Combating Illiteracy, and
 - Microenterprise Development

Role of NGOs in Promoting Human Rights (2)

- Advocacy & Representation
- Media Campaigns
- Providing Assistance
- Raising Public Awareness, Particularly to the Poor & Vulnerable Social Groups
- Monitoring of HR Situations

NGOs HR Activities: National Level

- Stimulate and Inform Public Debate on Human Rights Issues; and
- Assist the Government in Setting and Observing Appropriate Standards for Protecting Human Rights

NGOs HR Activities: National Level (2)

- Focus Attention on the Needs of Particularly Vulnerable & Disadvantaged Groups; and (e.g. Minorities, Immigrants, Children, Uneducated, Mentally Disturbed, Handicapped and Elderly); and
- Assume the Role of Observer of the Government and Parliament in the Process of Adopting Legislation.

Examples of NGOs Interventions

- Endeavour to Resolve Problems and Address Important Issues to Society such as:
 - Combat Poverty, Corruption and Economic Inequality;
 - Respond to Humanitarian Crises Including Armed Conflict;
 - Promote Public Freedom of Expression;
 - Support Crime Prevention, and the Rule of Law and Accountability;
 - Advocate Transparency of Government Budgets;
 - Work on Protecting the Environment;
